



ANISA National Security Report 2007

The Following Report was created by the Acadame North Intelligence and Security Agency (ANISA) a civilian Intelligence Agency, and this report is to be used to inform the People of the Socialist Federal Republic of Acadame North and the government on the status of National Security in the Country. The report can be considered unbiased. All context of this report is property of the government of the Socialist Federal Republic of Acadame North.

Border Security

Border Security has never been a major problem in the Socialist Federal Republic of Acadame North but the year 2006 and 2007 brought an increase of Persons illegally entering the country by 12%. This can be considered a breach of national security and the Secretariat of the Interior recommends the following:

- Call up one additional Unit in the Acadame North Territorial Defense Force in order to participate in frequent Border Patrol.
- Enforce UNAM Immigration Policy Regulations throughout the Country.
- Make inspections at checkpoints and barriers (both natural and man-made) more often.
- Inform the General Public on how to properly Cross the border.

Crime Rate

The Crime Rate in the Socialist Federal Republic of Acadame North has decreased in the past year. No major offenses were committed. Traffic violations remains the most common offense.

Imports and Exports

ANISA is recommending the Acadame North Internal Security Force inspect imports and exports more thoroughly and more frequently. This year alone we have seen a substantial increase on recalls of goods made overseas, so in order to protect the Health of Acadame North Citizens ANISA is recommending the following:

-The Government Propose an Agricultural Standards Policy for the Union of North American Micronations.

-Heighten Inspections of Imported Goods.

ANISA also recommends that the Internal Security Force adapt a rule that those who have experienced symptoms of a contagious Virus within the past 2 weeks before entering the country can be denied entry into Acadame North to protect the Health and well being of all citizens.

ANISA Protecting Acadame North's Interests Abroad

In the past year the Acadame North Intelligence and Security Agency has worked harder to protect Acadame North Citizens and interests abroad. Thanks to new policies and security agreements in UNAM, member states are now sharing information critical to Acadame North's National Security and well being.
