

## St Benedict's College 3-Chapel Cultural/fun walk at Gudja

On Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April, a total of 315 Year 4 pupils attending St Benedict's College Primary Schools met at Gudja Primary School to take part in a 4km three-chapel cultural/fun walk, following a triangular route joining the Bir Miftuh, Lunzjata and Ta' Loreto Chapels in Gudja.

On arrival at Gudja Primary School, the participating pupils were divided into three groups made up of pupils from the different college schools. Accompanied by their class teachers and LSA's, as well as by a number of school council members and helpers, each group of pupils walked to one of the three chapels where they were given a short talk about the history and the main architectural features of that particular chapel. Then the pupils walked on to the next chapel in a rotational pattern, until all three groups had visited all three chapels. An information pack about each of the three chapels was also distributed to the pupils on site. A short break for some rest and refreshments was included in the morning's schedule. Follow-up activities were held in the different primary schools. The pupils who participated enjoyed the activity thoroughly as the event





combined culture, physical activity and making new friends.
