

Ramkishen S. RAJAN is a Professor of Public Policy and International Economic Policy, George Mason University (GMU) in Virginia. He joined GMU in January 2006. Previously he was on the faculty of the School of Economics, University of Adelaide in Australia for five years and continues to be a visiting faculty there.

Professor Rajan is also a Visiting Senior Research Fellow and joint coordinator of the Regional Economic Studies Program at the Institute of Southeast Asian Studies (ISEAS) in Singapore, a Visiting Professor at the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, National University of Singapore, and a Senior Research Fellow at the Claremont Institute for Economic Policy Studies at the Claremont Graduate University in California. He has held shorter visiting positions at the Asian Development Bank Institute (ADBI), Hong Kong Institute of Monetary Research (HKIMR), and Institute of South Asian Studies (ISAS), National University of Singapore (NUS), Institute of Policy Studies (IPS), Singapore and other institutes in Asia. He has been a consultant with Asian Development Bank, World Bank, UN-ESCAP, Development Bank of Singapore among others.

Professor Rajan specializes in International Macroeconomics and Finance with particular reference to the emerging Asian economies. Specific topics of interest include currency and financial crises, international capital flows, foreign direct investment, exchange rate regimes and reserve policies, and Asian economic regionalism (monetary, financial and trade). His articles have been published in a number of international journals including *Economics Letters*, *Journal of International Money and Finance*, *Journal of International Development*, *Journal of Development Studies*, *Journal of Japanese and International Economics*, *Japan and the World Economy*, *Oxford Journal of Development Studies*, *World Economy*, and many others.

He holds graduate degrees from Michigan (M.A.) and Claremont (M.A. and PhD). His most recent authored/co-authored books are: *Exchange Rates and Foreign Direct Investment in Emerging Asia: Issues and Policies*, Routledge Press (forthcoming late 2011); *Crisis, Capital Flows and FDI in Emerging Asia*, Oxford University Press, 2011 (with Sasidaran Gopalan and Rabin Hattari); *Emerging Asia: Essays on Crises, Capital Flows, FDI and Exchange Rate Policy*, Palgrave-MacMillan Press, 2011; *Monetary, Investment and Trade Issues in India*, Oxford University Press, 2009; *Exchange Rates, Currency Crisis and Monetary Cooperation in Asia*, Palgrave-MacMillan, 2009; *Exchange Rate Regimes and Macroeconomic Management in Asia?*, Hong Kong University Press, 2009 (with Tony Cavoli); *Singapore's Trade and Investment Performance and Policies*, World Scientific, 2009 (with Shandre Thangavelu).

He is the Managing Editor of a new journal -- *Journal of International Commerce, Economics and Policy (JICEP)*. He has written for and been cited extensively in the media. In the past he has been a regular columnist on Asian macro and financial issues for India's *Financial Express* newspaper, *Economic and Political Weekly*, as well as *Singapore's Business Times*.
