Bracco Italiano

SY (4) 1 Towns & Lay's Braccorions Evangelina. Well made young b who sadly did not wish to perform to best effect today, despite several chances. Correctly shaped head leading into strong neck. Well angled fore and hind quarters producing a long effortless stride on the move. Excellent for type and balance throughout, caught sufficient glimpses of excellent profile action to clinch her this class win. Needs time & confidence. RBoB & BP. 2

Wainwright's Heinaaron Di Cioccolato Bianco at Shadowside. Cuts a typical outline on the stack and did not disappoint on the move, close up to winner however a little erratic in hind action today. 3 Griffiths' Stonerubi Beatrice Di Tenda.

O (2) 1 Wainwright's Shadowside Amore Ricco. Handsome upstanding male of good type & balance. Masculine head, intelligent expression. Strong neck, good shoulder placement & well developed brisket. Strong loin leading to well angled & muscled hindquarters. Moved with good reach from the shoulder and powerful drive from strong quarters. Put on an excellent performance in BIS, BoB & BIS4. 2 Cropper's Curlabull Serenity at Darrowdale. Sweet headed b, but very thin and lacking condition. Needs a bath.

Italian Spinone. A great entry which had a wonderful depth of quality. Sadly there were a few exhibits in desperate need of a bath – yellow stained filthy hocks are inexcusable.

J (8,2) Super class, some great prospects for the future heading it up. 1 Holt's Gioviale Roccamonfina. What an exciting prospect. Super shaped head of correct proportions, well set ears and eyes giving kind expression. Strong neck leading to correctly placed shoulders and good return of upper arm. Well ribbed back, slight arch to loin and slope to croup. Well set on tail. Hindquarters well angled & muscled, producing a strong driving action from low hocks. Very true up and down with a ground covering stride. Will no doubt mature into a fantastic specimen and is surely destined for great things, will watch his progress with interest. Handled with patience to get the best from him, BoB, BP & BPIS. 2 Shawcross & Parton's Afterglow Shooting Star. Close up to the winner, similar remarks apply however not quite the confidence nor accuracy of footfall of 1 today. Typical and balanced, with maturity should go on to do very well. 3 Cropper's Darrowdale Aislin's Dream.

PG (5,1) 1 Partridge's Amberellie Aldabella. Super b, very typical outline & great balance throughout. Sweet head, kind expression. Good neck, shoulder & upper arm. Well developed brisket. Ribs well sprung, short loin, sloping croup & well set on tail. Strong hindquarters. Excellent coverage of the ground on the move with an economic ground covering action. 2 Glazik's Laceygunn Glenglassaugh. Not too settled today, but a well made & balanced male. Unlucky to meet the winner in top form, but another good example. 3 Stanley's Jaylynne Angelyna.

O (7,2) 1 Coldwell's Sh Ch Wynsett Ruby Tuesday at Lucoru. Just about to edge into veteran, this b was in super condition and belied her years. Balanced in angulation, typical in outline, she is a great specimen. Sound honest mover with accurate footfall & good ground coverage. Had to give way to the effervescence of the youngster today and settle for RBoB. 2 Wilkins' Goldfly Magic's Little Man. Handsome d, not quite the shoulders of 1. Excellent head & expression, positive movement. 3 Wagh's Falkereden's Agnese Den Forste For Dewdhala.

Large Munsterlander. An entry low in numbers but high in quality.

PG (1) 1 Robins' Albadhu Talk To The Paw Dha Destanli. Correct head shape & expression. Neck fits smoothly into correct lay of shoulder, complimented by a decent length of upper

arm. Long ribcage, strong loin. Hindquarters well angled & particularly well muscled which was pleasing to see. Stood on excellent feet. Moved out well, accurate fore and aft. BoB. **O (2)** 1 Dowden & Raggett's Brockchime Snowdrop of Chontelle JW. Another excellent specimen, typical outline on the stack. Balanced in construction throughout & moving on a good length of stride. For BoB it was a close decision however I just felt the PG winner was more accurate in front action on the day. This b was also in good muscular condition, almost a rarity in some breeds. RBoB. 2 Waters' Tarkanya Lytas Llewellyn. Nicely made d with super hindquarters and yet another in very fit condition condition.

Pointer. A great entry, thank you to all who entered. Sadly there were a few dogs in need of having their nails cut, spoiling the shape of the foot and in some was no doubt affecting movement.

J (11, 3) The first three in this class could easily change places another day, they were a delight to judge. 1 Anthony's Jilony Texas Rose. Sweet headed baby possessing a wonderfully mischievous air which was a delight to see. Very well balanced for one so young & when settled produced a lovely action on the move with good reach & drive. Good shoulders, topline, ribs & hindquarters. One to watch as she matures. 2 Barford & Booth's Kiswahili You Live In Me for Protanto. Close up to the winner however a shade broader in the skull & yet to drop in brisket, but a nice b all the same. 3 Goode's Handsway Lola Bel Aire.

PG (5) 1 Barford & Booth's Kanix Calypso by Kiswahili. Sound quality b well presented & in good muscle. Head of good shape, broad enough over the skull. Reachy neck to good shoulder placement. Straight limbs & excellent feet. Well ribbed back leading to strong loin. Croup slopes gently to well set on tail. Stifles well turned & muscled, used to advantage on the move. Nicely handled however gave up a little in the challenge for BoB, I think the floor surface was not to her liking. 2 Goode's Handsway Perfect Storm. Upstanding young lad who is going to take a bit of time to come to maturity but has an excellent conformation & balance at this stage. Best of necks, superb topline & tailset. Moved out well & was more settled than the J winner to take BP & BPIS 3. 3 Walton's Galema Gael at Pointmoor.

O 1 Elrington, Green & Cannon's Ansona Lucy Lockett. Stunning b. So typical, feminine, curvy, and in the most fantastic condition. Sweet head & expression with well shaped eyes, correctly set ears and good length of muzzle. Strong, well arched neck, leading to great angulation of shoulder blade & upper arm. Well developed in brisket & ribbing. Short strong loin, sloping gently down to well set on short tail which she used effectively on the move. Produces a sound, accurate action on the move with scopy ground covering side gait, reaching forward from the shoulder and powering from low hocks. Has a great rapport with her handler and put on an excellent show. BoB & a much deserved RBIS. 2 Dunn's Meadowpoint Spirit Dancer ShCM. Very close up to the winner, another superb b in great condition & moving very well indeed. RBoB. 2 Anthony's Jilony Just Amazin JW.

Spaniel (American Cocker)

J (1) 1 Shepherd & Macbain's Fecimus Top Hat n Tails. Smart d with a good outline. Nicely shaped skull & eyes. Well set ears. Good length of neck. Balanced in angulation fore & aft. Moved out very confidently for one so young. In good coat and well muscled, nicely handled. BoB & BP.

Spaniel (Cocker)

P (7,3) 1 Boden's Joslynnville Wendy Darling Among Suelynda. Sweet & confident b with a typical outline. Nice head and expression, good neck, shoulder and upper arm. Well ribbed, plenty of body. Good hindquarter angulation & standing on good feet. Presented in good coat & condition, BoB & BP. 2 Reader's Asquanne Genial At Kanioo. Really nice puppy of

good shape & type, just giving a lot away in maturity. Should mature on very nicely. 3 Seaman's Oakrosa Remember Me.

J (2) 1 Benfield & Sneddon's Plaiglen Magic Jewel. Sweet headed b. In good coat & condition. Balanced fore & aft, just not giving her all on the move. In good coat, well handled but could do with more enthusiasm. RBoB. 2 Fenwick's Alisma Anton Stronger headed male presented in good coat.

O (3,1) 1 Reader's Kaniboo Midnight Diamond. Handsome looking male who showed very well. Balanced fore and aft, very merry on the move. Good feet and coat. Handled to advantage.
