



## Scarfy Come Home

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**The Scarf:** A long, lean, lacy scarf that's quick and easy to knit, and a great "one skein" project. The pattern is easily memorized and is a wonderful introduction to lace-knitting. Its basic stitch pattern is ideal for showing off multi-coloured or more highly-textured yarns.

Scarfy is an elegant, stylish travelling companion. Just take care not to accidentally leave him there while you're abroad!

**Size:** As long or as short as desired. It's up to you! Scarfy ended up being 8' long, perfect for winding around one's neck several times while still allowing for drape.

**Yarn:** 2 balls of Noro Silk Garden (45% Wool, 45% Mohair, 10% Lambswool, 122 yards each; colourway 84.) Any yarn of any weight may be used. At the very least, aim to use about 100 yards of yarn. If you're working with the numbers given here, you definitely won't need more than 200 yards!

**Needles:** One pair of US 8 (5 mm) needles. Go up a needle size (or two) if you'd like a longer, lacier Scarfy (or if you're using a bulkier yarn.)

**Gauge:** Gauge doesn't really matter. For reference purposes, Scarfy (who has never been blocked) is about 4" wide.

### The Pattern:

Cast on 20 sts.

**Rows 1-6:** K all sts.

**Row 7:** Yo, k2tog. Repeat across the entire row, for a total of 10 times.

**Row 8:** Yo, p2tog. Repeat across the entire row, for a total of 10 times.

**Row 9:** Repeat **Row 7**.

**Row 10:** Repeat **Row 8**.

Repeat **Rows 1-10** until scarf is desired length.

Bind off all sts loosely.

### Finishing:

Blocking is optional, though it would open the lace panels more. I never blocked Scarfy and he's plenty lacy. Happy Trails!

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
