



Is Genealogy Going to The Birds



PARROTTS & PEACOCKS

My Genealogy is going to the birds. I keep a loose leaf binder with all the names in my files. It is listed alphabetically with name, birth date, death date, spouse name, marriage date, and marriage location.

This can be made up in Family Tree Maker by selecting **REPORT** and then **CUSTOM**.

On the task bar above click on **contents** and you can choose **items to include** and **individuals to include**.

I recheck this name file twice a year on the available web sites and usually have good luck filling in some of my blank spaces. The greatest world wide site lately is

www.labs.familysearch.org

I have been researching for about ten years and have over 5000 names in my file. Two of the elusive surnames have been **PARROTT** and **PEACOCK** having the spouses but not their husbands first name has been difficult.

This week I found both the elusive birds. Two more great new sites for local research are:

which has Birth, Marriage, Death records for Cook County Illinois. It is a free site but you have to register your email address and come up with a password. If you want a copy of the record(s) they are \$15.00 each.

The second site is:

This will bring you to the state and then you can pick the county. All of the cemeteries in Kenosha are listed with photos of gravestones. I have found however that many are missing and sometimes the name doesn't match the stone. This is better than meeting the wolf at St. George cemetery.
